Awards will be given for grades K-4. Nominate only the most outstanding work.

ART PROJECTS

Categories for the Art Projects are:

- Visual Art
- Multimedia (i.e. Power Point)

Criteria for the Art Projects are:

- a) Originality
- b) Clear communication of meaning and message

Requirements for presentation of materials:

- Nominating form must be completed

WRITING PROJECTS

Categories for the Writing Projects are:

- Personal reflection
- Short story (2 page limit)
- Poetry

Criteria for Writing Projects are:

- a) Originality
- b) Well-developed and organized
- c) Effective use of language
- d) Evidence of voice
- e) Command of mechanics

Requirements for presentation of materials:

- ✓ Nominating form must be completed
- ✓ Double-spaced, typed or computer generated
